Fortunately for Ben and I, we were saved, but dozens of others fell victim to his initial assault. Later on though, few were lucky to survive.

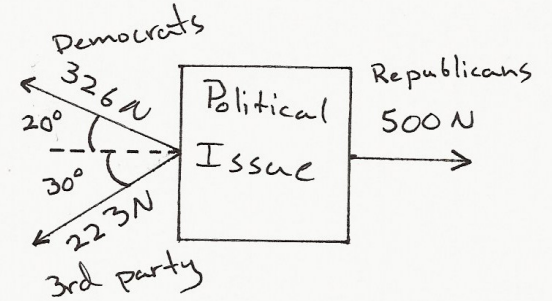
