The space dorm will be constructed shortly after the finishing touches on the space hotel are sorted out, which would mean we might see the space dorm's grand opening sometime around 2015. Tuition will increase drastically over the next few years in order to fund this grand endeavor, but with the assurance of comfortable living for the excess amounts of students that Tech expects to accept.

The space dorm will have its own dining hall serving a menagerie of packaged dehydrated foods and tasty goop from tubes, along with its own closed-system sparkling water source. Other amenities will include a zero-g weight room, a state-of-the-art Zambonis in Space simulator, and the world's first interstellar disc golf course.
