notice at this point. The August conference was postponed again til November 16.

With the date coming up very soon, and because of reason from above, the IPC chairmen motioned for a fourth postponement. The motion was seconded and the decision was unanimous among the 15-person council of planners. The only person that argued - though only for a minute - was Dr. Puall, who studies the severe cases of procrastination and the physiology behind the mental disorder. The doctor is the one who originally proposed the idea of the IPC to be held annually in Washington D.C. The IPC is for a five-day, weeklong event.

The most severe cases of procrastination, usually noted by physiologists in several cities and countries around the world, are invited to the conference in D.C. along with their doctors. Other physiologists are encouraged to apply for attendance to study the procrastinators in attendance. These subjects are always volunteers and are not bribed to attend the conference.

The first IPC was postponed no fewer than 39 times, though the postponements were only a month each. The 1st annual IPC was actually held in August 2004 in Washington D.C. The planning started in March of 1997 and a total of 35 patients and 70 doctors were in attendance. Doors were open to the public for a fee of \$5 to attend the 15 panels and 4 debates held during the IPC of 2004.

The next IPC started planning in September of 2004 and has been in planning ever since. The current numbers of panels is 18 and 5 planned debates for the public to view. The public attendance will be \$6 per person for a day pass and \$20 for a five-day pass to enter freely.

At the current time, the conference starts on Monday November 16, 2009 and the final panel will take place on November 20 at 10 pm in Ballroom A. 🕄
