Keweenaw Faced with Zombie Deer Outbreak - Deerpocalypse?

Over the past week, a zombie-like condition has overrun the population of white-tailed deer in the Houghton area. Deer have been seen to get up and walk after being killed by cars, logging trucks, hunters, or other affected deer. Traits to watch for include a slow shambling gait, visible rotting flesh, and occasional vocal outbursts resembling "HURRRRRRGH". So far the deer have been documented to be hanging out in large groups of 40 to 70 on the north side of the bridge, though cases have been reported as far as Chassell. Many researchers hypothesize that EVERY deer is infected, living or dead, and we may be facing a widespread extinction of the White Tailed Deer in the Upper Peninsula.

So far, no cases have been documented in which this "zombie-ism" has spread to humans, but extreme caution is advised.
