Now that Michigan Tech is back in full swing, that means literally hundreds of off-campus students have returned to town with no place to put their vehicles. Doggone snow! For those of us able to stay on top of the snow and ice or those who say "screw it" and park in the on-campus student lots, here's a few places to visit in your spare time. Everyone else: happy shoveling!

Pilgrim River Watershed Project. This multi-partner project is working to protect one of the largest blocks of land in the immediate Houghton area, a large stretch of forest alongside the Pilgrim River just south of town. With more than 1300 acres of land on the line, the Keweenaw Land Trust, Copper Country chapter of Trout Unlimited, and a number of other groups and individuals are all working together to raise the money needed to purchase the land's development rights to ensure it stays available for the public forever. The current landowners are will still own the land and will be able to log it appropriately, so it's really a win-win for everyone.

The project isn't done yet, but that doesn't mean you can't enjoy the benefits of what we've already accomplished. There's a lengthy trail that cuts across a major portion of the property that this time of year is perfect for snowshoeing or backcountry skiing. If the Tech Trails are too busy for you, consider making the looong (~2 mile) trek over to the Pilgrim and enjoy hundreds of acres practically for yourself. It's free to visit and I've never seen more than a few folks out there at a time.

There are a few different trailheads for the Pilgrim River Watershed Project, but the main one is located near the intersection of Pilgrim and Paradise Roads, just south of the Tech Trails. Park where the roads intersect wherever it is safe, and hop over the guardrail on the west side of Paradise Road and look for a big green info sign. The trail is well marked with blue blazes, though feel free to explore off trail. There's a lot of great views along the river, so grab

Blue Key Approves Porn

Hunter's Point. This little park probably has the highest ratio of Lake Superior shoreline to total area in the Keweenaw. Located across the harbor from Copper Harbor, Hunter's Point juts out into Superior and protects the town from heavy northern swells. The park was created a few years ago after developers put the land under pressure. The community came together to raise the money needed to keep it accessible for everyone and the rest is history. It's now a Township Park and has a parking area, pit toilet, and oodles of trails for you to enjoy.

I wouldn't visit Hunter's Point on a windy or stormy day, as you're likely to be blasted with ice and water from Lake Superior. The trails follow the shoreline on the narrow peninsula, wrapping around on both sides. Getting to the park is easy. Head west on M-26 out of Copper Harbor a short ways. Turn right onto North Coast Shores Road, then follow the road around and to the right until you make it to the parking area. The area is made up of really old rocks, but it's unlikely you'll be able to see that at this time of year. Instead, be on the lookout for ice on the harbor - maybe you'll be able to make your way across to the lighthouse!
