Report: 86% of Broomball Team Names Absolutely Terrible

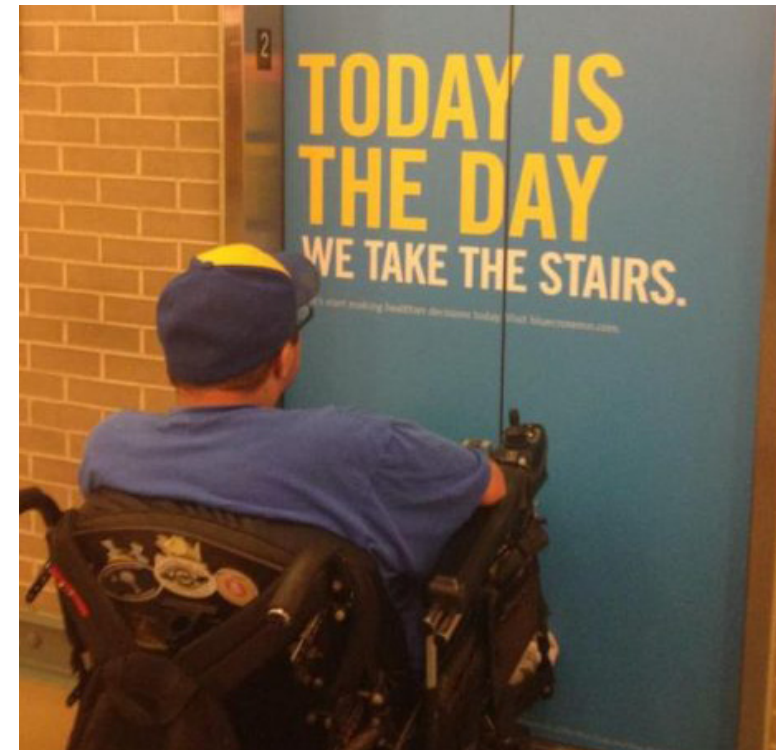
