## USG to Begin Taxing Student Organizations

At last Tuesday's mandatory-for-all-student-orgs-that-want-money HuskyLEAD event, USG treasurer Kyle Axline dropped the bomb: beginning next year, all student orgs will be taxed on planned funding they receive from USG.

"We saw this as a positive way to encourage our student organizations to seek money from other sources, instead of relying on us all the time," Axline said. "We aren't made of money, contrary to popular belief. We can't fund everything."

Taxes will be collected at the end of each school year. A set rate has yet to be determined, but organizations will be expected to pay back up to 10% of the money they receive through the yearly budget hearings. This does not include purchases made through requests to the Reserve Fund or Opportunities Fund. The revenue collected from the tax (est. ~\$30,000) will be used to redecorate MUB 106 again, unless someone else nicely asks for it first.

Student leaders attending the Tuesday's session left the room in silence, wondering how they were going to come up with funding. Once in the lobby of Fisher, they exploded with rage.

### MTU Nominated for NFGSS Award
