

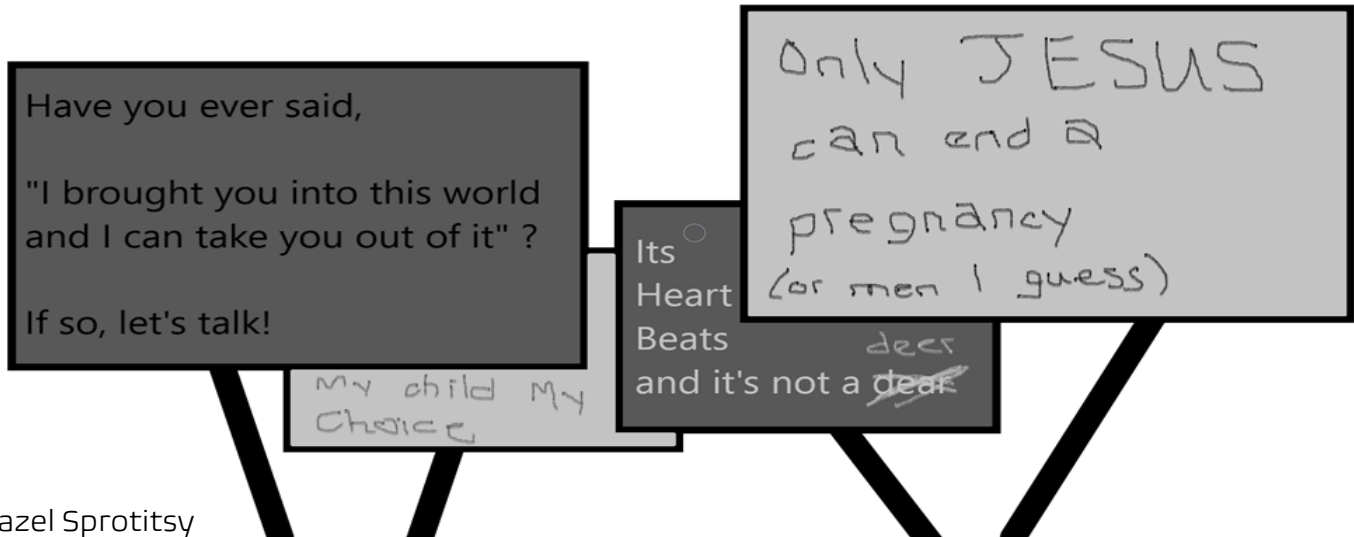

Abortion Controversy Further Complicates as "Anti-Choice" & "Anti-Life" Movements Emerge

As abortion remains one of the most controversial topics in American politics, there have historically only been two sides to the issue: pro-choice and pro-life. However, there now appear to be two new positions on the issue as "Anti-Choicers" and "Anti-Lifers" have entered the mix.

Pro-Choicers and Anti-Lifers both seem to agree that abortion should be legal and accessible for all women, but their motives appear to be drastically different. While Pro-Choicers feel that abortion should be legal so that women can choose what they do with their bodies, Anti-Lifers find that abortion is a groundbreaking solution to a tragic problem and a crucial part of curbing overpopulation -- and while Pro-Choicers agree with Life's Work by Willie Parker, Anti-Lifers feel more connected to A Modest Proposal by Jonathan Swift. It should be noted that Pro-Choicers and Anti-Lifers do not seem to associate with each other in front of opposition as each group feels that the other's motives are "insensitive" or "irrelevant" to the issue at hand. Extremist forms of the Anti-Life movement have been observed to believe in the sacrifice, murder, and cannibalism of babies and (occasionally) toddlers, but only when they aren't wanted by their parents.
