Spiteful MTU Student Develops Wizard 102

Portkey Game's Magical Action-RPG *Hogwarts Legacy* is set to launch this May, and the world of Potterheads and of course, Twitter, has been positively *abuzz*. However, not everyone is excited for the release— and at least one student here at Michigan Technological University has taken matters into their own hands— by developing a sequel to the original magic-based MMORPG: *Wizard 101*.

The sequel, obviously named *Wizard 102*, seeks to preserve many of the original design elements from the first game that made it so great, while also adding in new flavors. Many of the original worlds, such as Wizard City, Krokotopia, Mirage, and Lemuria will still be in the new game, but with added areas and more detail. However, *Wizard 102* will also feature new worlds, such as: South Eros, with a medieval England theme; Bronyland; Middle Zealand, the land of the elves, dwarves, orcs, and humans; CouchPebble, with foot-powered mounts available for microtransaction purchase; Runescape, themed around mining and crafting; Palacestone, featuring such notable characters as the Small Merperson, Andrial, the Resting Average, Borealis, and Mulan, to appeal to Chinese audiences; Burgertopia, the land of the Eagles; and Fozzyland, where you meet the Wizard of Fozz.

Your favorite characters from the first game are set to make a new appearance as well, though some with a new twist. Belladonna Crisp once again features as the Headmistress of Pigswick Academy, now the player's default school, and has been redesigned by Blizzard Entertainment. Don't worry— she still sends your 11 year-old character into active warzones on oddly personal fetch quests. But don't worry: Prospector Zeke has already mapped out every world and has lost items literally everywhere in them all. And let's not forget Duel Master, Diego, who now is played by the character from the hit TV show, *Go Diego Go!*

Developers promise both nostalgia and a fresh experience from the very start, right down to the character creation menu: now with sliders, and the option to have a trans character (Kings' Isle supports the rights of all players to pay them exorbitant amounts of money)! Old fan-favorite quest lines have been reworked, including a quest line where your character fights the Norse gods instead of the Greek ones to become the new God of War.
