Holden McCox is a reserved man in his mid thirties, who lives in a small, tidy house in a quiet community in Realplace, Indiana. By day, he works as a snail farmer, earning a modest living to support his family. However, he also has what he likes to think of as a "secret alter ego" online.

"I do my most valuable work here" He says, gesturing towards his computer on his desk in his small office, adjacent his bedroom. The desk has a few books on the ground next to it, mostly relating to World War II, Lord of the Rings, and Star Wars, and several notebooks rest on top filled with notes and citations. These, he says, are just some of his references. Most of the information he gets are from his bookmarks on the internet, mostly Wikipedia.

McCox is a prolific internet debater, or as he prefers to call himself "a warrior for truth". He says he often frequents sites like Instagram, Twitter, Reddit, TikTok, Facebook, Quora, looking for people who are wrong about things or who disagree with I'm right." However, he also says he's been him. Citing the availability of information on the internet these days, he notes that "To me, there really is no excuse for being wrong about anything ever." Thus, he has made it his mission to educate everyone on the internet who say something false by telling them, repeatedly, that they're stupid and wrong.

The longest has been 5 years now, in a reddit thread so deep that McCox says he hit the reply limit and they had to move it to DMs.

"The other guy keeps cycling back to the same few bullshit things" he says in frustration. According to McCox, the replies start to sound repetitive, as though they were being generated by a computer. Nevertheless, he'll never stop "Until the last wrongsayer knows I'm right."


