Uncommitted Announces Presidential Bid

After a massive grassroots effort spanning just a few weeks before the Michigan Primaries last Tuesday, "Uncommitted" emerged as a strong contender for the Democratic Party nomination against Joseph R. Biden. In just that small amount of time, organizers and activists were able to mobilize an incredible 101,000 votes to support Uncommitted, who was hardly known to many voters before then. This far exceeded the 10,000 votes organizers hoped to achieve, approximately the margin that determined the state's outcome against the less dubious of the two Clintons in 2016, and close to the 154,000 vote margin that determined the state in 2020.
