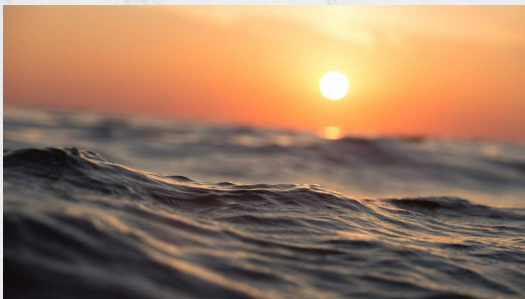

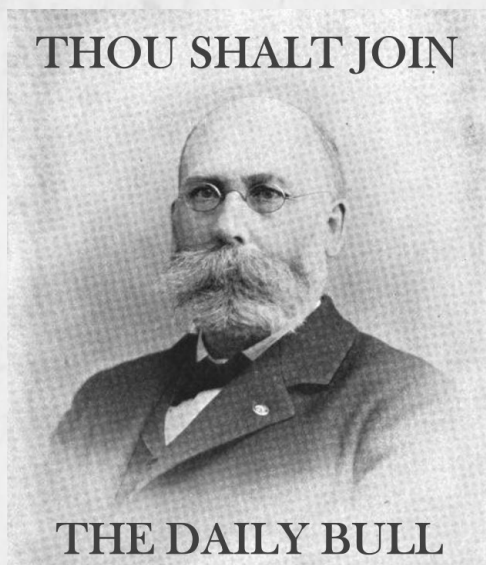
Concerning Number of Today's Youth Converting to Monotheism
