MTU Constructing Mob Spawners

Officials Cite the Need for more Loot

Michigan Technological University is growing quickly, expanding into new programs and constructing dedicated buildings for existing programs. The overall construction planning project is referred to as the "Master Plan", and includes such projects as constructing the new H-STEM building between ChemSci and the EERC, expanding the Tennis Center and Memorial Union, and repurposing buildings like the Lakeshore Center and Harold Meese building. The goal is to "Build the Future" and MTU's place in it as a leading academic research institution first, and prominent university for STEM education second. Such a wide array of projects requires vast amounts of materials and cost. As a consequence, MTU has decided to subsidize some of the cost by erecting a series of mob spawners on the East side of campus. These spawners take the form towers with dark, enclosed interiors, in which new students can spawn to help fund the university's development and the President's salary with their tuition. Eventually, the campus Master Plan calls for a structure to be built around the spawners to house the students after they spawn in, temporarily named "East Hall" ("The Washington Football Team" of campus dorms halls, just less cool-sounding) until a donor offering an appropriate sum of cash money is found to name the hall after. The idea is that students will be forced to leave the dorm building to face the biting cold and cross the highway at least occasionally, as there will be no dining hall in the new dorm building. This will be the



mechanism for drawing students out of the spawners, thus allowing the University to harvest their loot in the form of tuition. As the new installations certainly stand out, they have drawn attention from critics as well as the cushy-chaired corner-office folk who concocted the scheme in the first place. The major resistance to the plan stems from doubts regarding the efficacy of the project in general. The architects of the spawners did account for the fact that students generally require a light level of 7 or less to spawn, with College of Computing students needing a light level of 5 or less, both helped by northerly latitude and winter semesters. However, critics point out that the mob spawn chance in the towers is lessened due to the presence of the many unlit mines and tunnels below the ground, and the fact that there is a limit to the number of mobs spawning per chunk. The moral question of extracting value from undergraduate students, the wellbeing of whom isn't even the second priority behind research proficiency and university prestige, was obviously deemed not worth considering.
