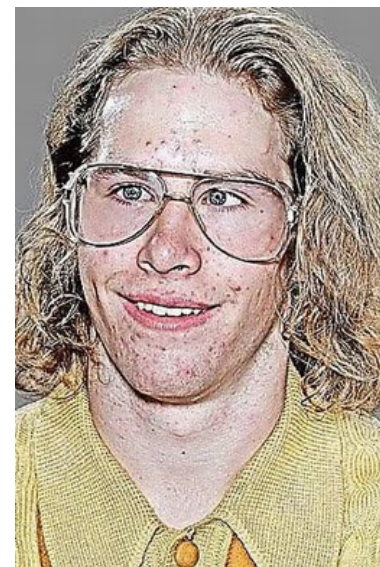
“They refuse to leave until their code has finished compiling, and God knows how long that will take,” a Wads

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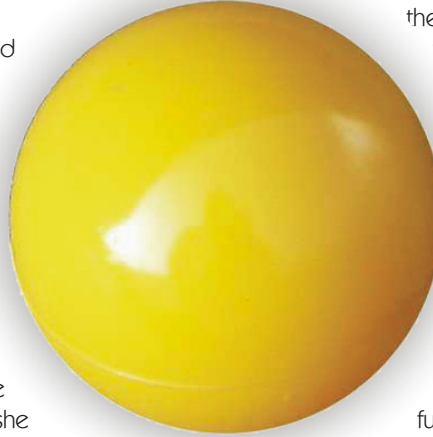
