Civilization VII will be Open-World Sandbox

And Other Features begat by Sid Meijer himself



Sid Meijer's Civilization VII has been announced with much hullabaloo and hubbub, as Civilization fans around the world rejoice at yet another installment in a venerated series for them to sink their time and money into. After launching Civilization 6 a whopping eight years ago with a huge step up from Civ 5 in terms of features and gameplay complexity, Firaxis has set the bar high for themselves. According to the prerelease materials they have announced, it's clear they think they've delivered.

Having witnessed the flash-in-a-pan success of games like Fortnite, Firaxis has announced that Civilization VII will be free to play and live service. Instead of charging for the game and the DLC, Firaxis will be monetizing the game via unskippable ads at the end of each turn, and microtransactions that allow you to purchase customizable cosmetics for your leader of choice. They hope this will attract players who are new to the series, and allow them to keep delivering fresh content via live updates, keeping the game fresh and dynamic.

Some of these cosmetic options take the form of a revolutionary step that even Todd Howard himself hadn't conceived of: purchasable slider options in a character customization screen. The base game will allow you to customize your own leader, allowing you to choose from some predefined abilities and changing your character's appearance between a few preset selections. However, you can unlock customization sliders with a few quick purchases for the low-low price of 123,939.99 ^d. They are also offering an optional hardware peripheral that can be configured to punch you like Muhammad Ali's alarm clock to get you to stop playing because it's been like 8 hours and you're slowly morphing into a vegetable.

In addition to microtransactions, Civ VII will have several new modes. These include a Battle Royale PvP mode, building on what was trialed briefly in Civ 6; a split-screen Co-op mode, where two players control the same civilization but cannot see what each other did until the turn ends; and Twitch Integration, where a streamer's Twitch Chat can directly run their civilization. They've also listened to players' wails of agony and made some quality of life changes, including: adding more keyboard shortcuts to let you rage quit the game easier, removing nukes from Gandhi, renaming the "Next turn" button to the "Just One More Turn..." button, UI updates "borrowed" from modders of Civilization 6, and giving Gandhi more nukes.
